

History

The Palace Theatre was designed by Thomas Lamb with France's Palais de Versailles in mind. In 1926, the theatre opened with nearly 3000 seats available. Great attention was paid to the hall's acoustics as it was meant for performers to be heard without amplification.



Issue

With the shows and their customers in mind, the theater was concerned with their aging drain pipes. A Flow-Liner[®] Installer was contacted for preventative maintenance.
